

Homeopathy regulation by Sri Lanka Homoeopathic Medical Council

The Homoeopathy regulations of Diploma, BHMS, MD (Hom), Licentiate Homoeopathic Medical Practitioner, Bachelor of Medicine and surgery, Diploma in Homoeopathic Pharmacy, Nurse Cum Pharmacist courses in Homoeopathy at Sri Lanka

Homoeopathic medical education Systematization Regulations

In Accordance with the powers vested by Section 22 a -e ,section 23 (1) a- -l and section 24 of the Homoeopathic Act ,No.7of 1970 and to exercise the powers the council shall take the following steps to control ,Regulate and upgrade the Homoeopathic Medical education and here by makes the following regulations.

1.SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

These Regulation shall be called “ **HOMOEOPATHIC MEDICAL EDUCATION SYSTEMATIZATION REGULATIONS OF SRI LANKA HOMOEOPATHIC MEDICAL COUNCIL**”

They Shall come in to force on the date of their publication in the Gazette of Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka.

The Regulations and the Syllabus are subject to modification by the Homoeopathic medical education and Examination Board.

The Homoeopathic Medical council shall start a model Homoeopathic Medical college in the council Land at 94 Shelton Jayasinghe Mawatha, Welisara ,Ragama to impart Homoeopathic Medical Education.

2. Definations In these regulations ,Unless the context otherwise requires

- i. “Act” means The Homoeopathic act of 1970.
- ii. “college” means the homoeopathic medical college run by the Homoeopathic medical council
- iii. “ Board” means The Homoeopathic Medical Education and Examination board.
- iv. “President” means The President of Homoeopathic medical Council.
- v. “Director” The director of education of the Homoeopathic Medical college.
- vi. “Principal” Means the Principal of the Homoeopathic Medical college.

3.NAME OF THE COLLEGE:

The Name of the College Shall Be “ **Mahinda Rajapaksha Homoeopathic Medical College And Hospital**”

4. Vision of the College:

As per its Strategic Plan, The vision of the college is to be credible and dynamic Homoeopathic medical education contributing to the Health care prosperity of Sri Lanka.

In addition to provide strategic leadership for the medical sector the college provides Prudential and pro-activate national Health care policy recommendations to the Government with the highest integrity and professionalism.

5.Mission of the college:

The College shall strive to Generate High quality Human resources with best Knowledge and skills in Homoeopathic Field.

6.Governing Body of the College:

The College shall be governed by a nine member board consist of all members of Homoeopathic medical council, a ministry official appointed by the minister and a Homoeopathic Practitioner appointed by the President of Homoeopathic medical Council.

6.1.Name of the Governing body:

The Name of the Governing Body Of the College Shall be Homoeopathic Medical education and Examination Board of Sri Lanka.

6.2Chairman of the board and powers:

a) The President of the Homoeopathic council shall be the Chairman of the governing board of the college.

b) Every board meeting is chaired by the President. If the President desires he could delegate it to any member of the board.

c) The Chairman has the power to appoint a new member from the registered Homoeopathic medical practitioner when a member of the board absent for three consecutive meetings.

d) The chairman shall call for Special meetings with Short notice if any urgent circumstance arise.

6.3Director Education:

a) Director Education a competent person in the subject Shall be Appointed by the Governing board.

b) The director shall be responsible for the educational affairs of the college.

c) The director shall associate with the principal of the college and guide for the smooth running of the college.

6.4.Powers of the Board:

a) The board shall be the supreme body in decision making and implementing the programs.

b) The board will have the power to appoint a director for the educational affairs of the college.

c) The board shall decide and make changes on the course fees and admission fees.

d) The board shall recruit the Teaching faculties and other staffs of the college.

e) The board shall develop the curriculum and syllabus with the assistance of Academic staffs.

f) The Board Shall have the power to appoint competent Lecturers and Professors As internal or external examiners to conduct the examinations of the college

g) The Board shall appoint an experienced person who has knowledge of all sector of the college in managing a Homoeopathic Medical college as the principal of the college,. He shall be responsible for all affairs of the college.

- h) The board shall decide on Scheme of Scholarship time to time.
- i) The board shall decide a special fees structure and admission fees for foreign Students.

6.5 Secretary of the board:

The registrar of the Homoeopathic medical council Shall be appointed as the secretary of the board.

6. Courses Proposed, Duration, eligibility and Medium :

6.1

Name of the Course : Licentiate Homoeopathic Medical Practitioner (L.H.M.P)

Duration of the Course : Two years (2)

Eligibility : All Unregistered Homoeopathic medical Practitioners thos Who submitted information to the previous council in 1998 And approved by then ministry Senior assistant secretary And registrar of the council are eligible to apply. And those have practiced Homoeopathy more than six Years prior to 1998. Subject to certified by the Grama Sevaka and divisional Secretary.

Examination : The candidates will be given there opportunity to sit for examination and the course shall be discontinued thereafter.

Curriculum: Subject of study and examination (Annexure : A)

6.2

Name of the Course : Diploma in Homoeopathic Medicine and surgery (DHMS)

Duration of the Course: Four Years (4)

Eligibility : All unregistered practitioners who has the basic Educational qualification of GCE O/L with Science Eligible to apply. (They will Have to follow one year course Concurrently with the 1st Year medical education to fulfill the A/L standard.).

Examination : The candidates will be given three opportunity to sit for the Examination and the course shall be discontinued there After.

Curriculum : Subject of study and examination (Annexure: B)

6.3

Name of the Course : Diploma in Homoeopathic Medicine (DHM)

Duration of the Course: One year.

Eligibility : All Registered Homoeopathic medical practitioners are Eligible to apply for the course.

Examination : The candidates will be given three opportunity to sit for the Examination and the course shall be discontinued there After.

Curriculum Subject of study and examination.(annexure: C)

6.4

Name of the Course : Bachelor of Medicine and surgery (MBS)

Duration of the Course: One Year

Eligibility : All Registered Homoeopathic Medical Practitioners those who have either obtained DHMS or DHM or DMS are eligible to apply.

Examination :The candidates will be given three opportunity to sit for the And the course shall be discontinued there after.

Curriculum : Subject of study and examination (Annexure: D)

6.5

Name of the Course : Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and surgery (BHMS)

Duration of the Course: Five and half years (51/2)

Admission Qualification: Students who have successfully passed the advanced level A/L examinations shall be admitted to the course.

Medium of Teaching: As all the classical literatures available in English, the medium of instruction shall be in English only.

Pre English class : The students selected for the course shall be given a three months English class.

Number of Students in one batch: An ideal batch may be of fifty students in one batch. Only one batch is proposed per year.

Curriculum : Subject for study and examination of BHMS (Annexure:E)

6.6

Post Graduate Courses:

Name of the Course : Doctor of Medicine in Homoeopathy. M.D.Hom

Duration of the Course : 3 Years.

Course of Study :

- a) Organon of Medicine With Homoeopathic Philosophy.
- b) Homoeopathic Materia medica including applied aspects.
- c) Repertory.
- d) Homoeopathic Pharmacy.
- e) Practice of Medicine
- f) Paediatrics

g) Psychiatry.

Eligibility : Candidate Should have Passed BHMS Or DHMS and have four years' experience.

Curriculum : Subject For study and examination of M.D Hom (Annexure; F)

6.7

Name of the course : **Post Graduate Diploma In Homoeopathic Medicine** PG.Dip. Hom

Duration of the Course : Two Years

Eligibility : All Registered medical practitioner who has obtained a Degree in their medical system and desire to study Homoeopathy are eligible to apply.(MBBS,BAMS,BUMS BDS, BVS,BSMS)

Curriculum : Subject to study and Examination (Annexure:G)

7. The college will consist of twelve departments as follows.

- I. Department of Pharmacy.
- II. Department of Organon of Medicine.
- III. Department of Materia Medica.
- IV. Department of Pathology.
- V. Department of Anatomy.
- VI. Department of Physiology.
- VII. Department of Social & Preventive Medicine
- VIII. Department of Forensic medicine & toxicology.
- IX. Department of Gynaecology.
- X. Department of Surgery.
- XI. Department of practice of Medicine.
- XII. Department of case taking &Repertorisation.

7.I.1Department of Homoeopathic Pharmacy

(a) Demonstration room – There shall be one demonstration room to accommodate about 50 students with arrangement for audio-visual aids.

(b) Laboratory – Sufficient accommodation shall be provided for laboratory tables with shelves and cupboard fitted with water taps and sinks on the table top with electric and gas points to accommodate 50 students. A store and equipment necessary for practical in pharmacy shall be provided.

(c) Herbarium for medicinal plants shall also be provided.

(d) Museum – With cupboards and shelves for storing and display of herbarium sheets, charts and specimens with adequate sitting arrangements for students shall be provided.

(e) College shall provide a medicinal plant garden in its vicinity with facility to grow plants used in Homoeopathic preparations.

7.1. II. Department of Anatomy

(a) Dissection Hall – (i) It shall be spacious enough to accommodate four dissection tables. Provision for ventilation

and lighting shall be made; Mosaic tanks for preservation of dissected parts and wash basins and a small office room attached to the dissection hall shall be provided.

(ii) Accommodation and provision for storage of cadavers, maceration chamber, storeroom for instruments, chemical and bones and skeletons shall be made.

(b) Museum – Accommodation shall be provided for racks and shelves for storing and proper display of wet and dry specimens, models, revolving stands for skiagram and trolley tables.

(c) Demonstration room – There shall be a demonstration room fitted with audio-visual aids to accommodate 50 students and located in proximity to the dissection hall and museum, with provision for shelves for skiagrams and stereoscopic viewing boxes.

(d) Histology – Sufficient accommodation for workbenches fitted with water taps, sinks cupboards and electric points for 50 students.

7.1.III. Department of Physiology and Biochemistry

(a) Demonstration room – There shall be a demonstration room to seat 50 students and with arrangements for audio-visual aids.

(b) Practical Class rooms – Human Physiology room with adequate accommodation shall be provided to accommodate 50 students for blood studies, determination of basal metabolism, blood gas analysis, blood pressure measurements, testing of respiratory functions, recording of pulse and respiration and testing of special senses.

(c) Animal room and Frog tank shall be provided.

(d) Practical classroom for Biochemistry – Accommodation for Laboratory benches fitted with shelves and cupboards, water taps, sinks, electric and gas points for 50 students shall be provided. A store and equipment necessary for Biochemistry experiments shall be provided.

7.1.IV. Department of Pathology and microbiology

[a] Laboratory- Tables with reagents, shelves, cupboards fitted with water taps and sinks on the table top with electric and gas points to accommodate 50 students with attached storeroom.

[b] In addition, service laboratories for all necessary investigation and suitable equipment shall be provided in the attached Hospital.

[c] Demonstration- One room shall be provided to accommodate 50 students with arrangements for audio-visual aids.

[d] Museum- sufficient accommodation for show cases and cupboards for minimum of 100 specimens.

7.1.V.Department of community Medicine.

[a] Museum- Adequate accommodation for the display of models, Charts, specimens and other material concerning communicable diseases, diet, Homoeopathic prophylactics, National health programmes, immunization, community Health, family welfare, bio statistics ,sociology.

[b]The college shall adopt two village in the periphery and make health camps with the students to make them aware of the community oriented problems and have at least one attached primary health centre.

7.1.Vi.Department of Forensic Medicine and Toxicology.

[a] Museum- Adequate accommodation for display of medico legal specimens, dangerous weapons, models, charts and audio-visual teaching materials.

[b] Laboratory for examination.

7.1.Vii. Clinical Departments,

(i.e. Practice of medicine, surgery, Obstetrics and gynaecology, Homoeopathic Materia medica & Therapeutics, Organon of Medicine and Homoeopathic Philosophy (including History of medicine), case taking and repertory will be attached with the Hospital. Relevant audio visual teaching aids/ materials shall also be provided in the concerned departments.

The teaching homoeopathic hospital shall provide facilities for imparting practical and clinical skills to make the clinical students self-reliant and confident to understand the clinical problem, diagnose the same with a great amount of accuracy, prescribe a rational medication. The students shall also be made to understand the scope and limitation of the system. Facility shall be provided to inculcate a sense of Research aptitude with Homoeopathic Medicine in Various clinical fields, render service to the community oriented health problems. Facility shall also be provided to train on the management of emergencies and take active participation in calamities, life supportive systems and its handling .

There shall be facility to handle all types of clinical cases. The hospital shall provide consultants from all fields of medicine and Rehabilitation. The hospital shall train the students in appropriate diagnostic techniques, other supportive methodologies, research methodology

Supervise the patients and to watch the limitations.

The following essential components shall be available in a teaching hospital.

7.2 Physical Infrastructure:

The hospital shall have a well-equipped outpatient department with the sections of medicine (including acute and chronic diseases),

Surgery (including ear ,nose , throat,) Gynecology and obstetrics, Ophthalmology , Paediatrics , Psychiatry, dental ect. The indoor and outpatient departments of the hospital shall be in running condition. Round the clock emergency department shall be provided.

In addition to the accommodation mentioned the hospital shall also **Provide the following :**

- 1) Hospital superintendent's office room with attached toilet , and a retiring room, when necessary.
- 2) Visitors room with toilet facilities.

- 3) Canteen.
- 4) Reception and inquiry: This shall preferably be computerized and networked with other essential areas in the hospital and college.
- 5) Central registration.
- 6) Statistics department with computer facilities.
- 7) Clinical department for out patients.
- 8) Clinical laboratory for investigation techniques. The laboratory shall be equipped to undertake Pathological and biochemical investigation for the hospital. Space for patients to wait for specimen collection shall be provided.
- 9) An emergency section with facility to receive patients at any time of the day and night , manned by house physicians/residents supported by resident medical officers.
- 10) An in patient department to admit patients.
- 11) Operation theatre to meet the surgical cases and emergencies.
- 12) Minor Operation theatre to provide minor services.
- 13) Labour room.
- 14) Central store linen.
- 15) Separate store rooms for consumable and non consumable items.
- 16) Medicine store.
- 17) Dispensing room with facility for the patient to wait for collection of medicines.
- 18) Mortuary with facility to preserve the dead body.
- 19) Residential accommodation for principal, resident medical officers , nursing staff , auxiliary staffs, house staffs , surgeon, obstetrician and Physician; Where surgeon, obstetrician and physician are not provided residential accommodation in the premises , they shall be available round the clock for call duty and shall be provided with adequate communication facility.
- 20) Central Medical record section with facility for a data bank.
- 21) Staff committee room.

The hospital shall arrange consultation of honorary physicians, Guest physicians or other expert in the medical and allied field and for achieving the objectives.

In the hospital there shall be not less than two lecture theatres that can accommodate the number of students permitted for admission to facilitate teaching and training by demonstration of cases.

Clinical Departments in the Hospital:

For clinical teaching in the hospital the beds shall be distributed as under:-

A. MedicineWard:

1. General Medicine -50% (Acute10% and chronic 40%)

2. Peadiatrics -10%

B. Surgery Ward -20%

C. Obstetrics &Gynae -20%

7.3 Requirements for a Homoeopathic Medical college.

The requirements for a Homoeopathic medical college shall such as :

I. Land, Accommodation for college, hospital, hostels, canteen, library and auxiliary services.

II. Teaching Faculties.

III. Laboratory and Equipment.

IV. Hospital.

V. Library.

VI. Other accommodations.

Accommodation:

1) College: 4class rooms to accommodate 50 students, adequate space for recreation, staff rooms and Principals room, one conference/meeting room with proper ventilation toilet facilities etc.

2) Hospital Building: Hospital shall accommodate beds in the ratio of 1:1 with facilities for auxiliary services.

3) Library : The library shall be spacious, Well ventilated with facility to store books periodicals, journals, news papers etc. There shall be facilities for seating at least fifty students, space for books, journals etc.

4) Canteen: The institution shall have space of about 1000sq.ft. for a student canteen.

5) Staff Quarters: An ideal institution need to have staff quarters in the premises. This need not be insisted for all categories of staff .However there is a need to have mandatory facilities for the essential staffs, the principal/Director, Medical Superintendent etc.

6) Students Hostel: Hostels for male and female students separately shall be provided within or nearby the college campus with sanitary facilities, mess common room and game facilities. The interns may be accommodated in the hostel near the hospital . to start with facilities shall be provided to accommodate 50 boys and 50 girls in separate hostels. This can be done on lease basis/hire basis or ownership basis.

Teaching Faculties:

a) Head of the Departments: Qualified Competent experts in the respective subjects will be appointed as the head of the department.

b) Lecturers : Qualified competent lecturers from India as well as from Sri Lanka as required by various subject of the course will be appointed.

c) Visiting Lecturers : Senior lecturers and professors from various Homoeopathic Medical colleges of India will be appointed as visiting lecturers.

d) Principal of the College: Principal shall be one of the professors of any department.

(Regulations and Guidelines of Central Council Of Homoeopathy India is followed.)

8.Attendace, Admission & scheme of Examination:

Attendance: Minimum attendance appear for the examination for all courses is 75% of the total hours devoted for the course.

Pass mark: Pass mark For all courses in all subjects both Homoeopathic and all medical subjects shall be 50% in each part(written oral and practical) and 50% in aggregate.

All candidate of all courses should appear for a 3 hours theoretical paper as well as a oral and practical examination in each subject.

1st BHMS Examination:

- i. Any undergraduate may be admitted to the 1st BHMS examination provided that he has regularly attended the courses of instruction in the subjects of the examination theoretical and practical for not less than one and half years, at a Homoeopathic Medical college to the satisfaction of the head of such college.
- ii. 1st BHMS examination will be held at the end of 18 months of BHMS course.
- iii. All candidate should appear for a 3 hours theoretical paper as well as a oral and practical examination in each subject.
- iv. Pass mark in all subjects both Homoeopathic and all medical subjects shall be 50% in each part(written oral and practical) and 50% in aggregate.
- v. In order to pass the BHMS examination a candidate must pass in all subjects of the examination.
- vi. A candidate securing 75% or above marks in any of the subject shall be declared to receive honors in that subject provided he has passed the examination in the first attempt.

2nd BHMS Examination:

No candidate will be admitted to 2nd BHMS examination unless

- i. Has passed the 1st BHMS examination at least one year previously and.
- ii. Has regularly attended the following course of instructions theoretical and practical in the subjects of the examination over a period of at least one year in a recognized Homoeopathic medical college subsequent to his passing the 1st BHMS examination to the satisfaction of the head of the college
- iii. The 2nd BHMS examination shall be held in the end of 2/1/2 years of BHMS course.
- iv. The examination shall be written oral and Practical.
- v. In order to pass the 2nd BHMS examination, a candidate shall have passed in all subjects of the examination.
- vi. Pass marks in all subjects, Homoeopathic and allied medical subjects shall be 50% in each part (written oral and practical)
- vii. If any student securing 75% or above marks in any of the subjects shall be declared to receive honours in that subjects provided he has passed the examination in the first attempt.

3rd BHMS examination

No candidate shall be admitted to the 3rd BHMS examination unless:

- i. Has passed the 2nd BHMS examination at least previously and Has regularly attended the following course of instruction theoretical and practical in the subjects of examination over a period of at least two years in a Homoeopathic college subsequent to his/her passed the 1st BHMS examination to the satisfaction of the college
- ii. The 3rd BHMS examination Shall be held at the end of 3 1/2 years of BHMS course.

- iii. The examination shall be written oral practical and clinical.
- iv. A candidate securing 75% or above marks in any of the subjects shall be declared to receive honours in that subjects provided he has passed the examination in first attempt.
- v. In order to pass 3rd BHMS examination a candidate shall have passed in all subjects of the examination.
- vi. Pass marks in all subjects, both homoeopathic and allied medical subjects shall be 50% in each part.

4th BHMS examination

No candidate shall be admitted to the IV BHMS examination unless:

- i. HE/She passed the 3rd BHMS examination at least one year previously and Has regularly attended the following courses of instructions, theoretical and practical in the subjects of the examination over a period of at least three years in a recognized Homoeopathic medical college subsequent to his passing the 1st BHMS examination to the satisfaction of the head of the college.
- ii. The 4th BHMS examination shall be held at the 4 1/2 years of the BHMS course.
- iii. The examination shall be written ,Oral ,practical or clinical.
- iv. A candidate securing 75% or above in any of the subjects shall be declared to receive honours in that subject provided he/she has passed the examination in first attempt.
- v. In order to pass 4th BHMS examination a candidate shall have passed in all subjects.
- vi. Pass mark in all subjects both homoeopathic and allied medical subjects shall be 50% in aggregate.

Examiners:

There shall be two examiners , one internal and one external examiner for each subjects for conducting the oral and practical. Paper one will be valued by the internal examiner and part two will be valued by the external examiner. Experienced competent persons will be appointed as examiner.

9.PeripheralClinics:

The College shall establish five peripheral clinics to treat outdoor patients and it will be increased accordance with the strength of the students.

10.Paramedical Courses in Homoeopathy.

10.1Nursing Course in Homoeopathy:

There is a need to have sensitive nursing personnel duly trained in patient care with the background of the Homoeopathic philosophy ,organon of Medicine and Homoeopathic Pharmacy. They need to posses basic knowledge of Homoeopathic Medicine and its application.

The college shall employ 20 trained and duly registered nurses in the hospital and train them simultaneously in the above said Homoeopathic subjects in rotational basis for a batch of 10 while they are in service in the Homoeopathic Hospital until they are fully conversant with the subjects. On

the completion of this course they will be awarded a diploma In Homoeopathic Nursing by examination.

Arrangements would made with the Homoeopathic Medical council to maintain a register of qualified Homoeopathic nursing staff.

A two and half year diploma in Homoeopathic Nursing course for a batch of twenty students shall be followed by this.

10.2. Pharmacy course:

Name of the course : Diploma in Homoeopathic Pharmacy (D.Pharm.Hom)

Duration of the course : Two years

Eligibility : GCE O/L with English ,Maths, and Science

Curriculum : Subjects of study and examination (Annexure:H)

11. Alternative System of Medicine:

The college Shall have a separate unit to conduct Diploma and PG.DIP courses in alternative system of medicine only for registered medical practitioners as accordance with Guide line Of World Health Organization.

Diploma in Acupuncture
